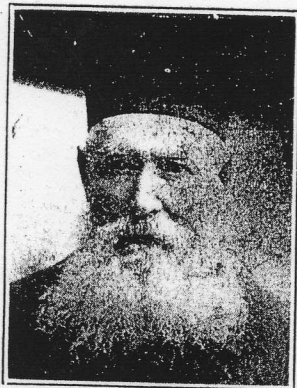

THE STORY OF THE ORIGIN OF OUR FAMILY VEREIN



ENOCH BIALYSTOTSKY

It is necessary at our 8th Anniversary, which we are now celebrating, to give our younger generation a bit of the history relating to the founding of our society, the Bnai Enoch & Tzivia Familie Vereïn.

On the 3rd of April, 1902, the ship, Potsdam, brought from Bialystok the family Bialystotsky (now called Rosenberg). There were five members of the family, Reb Enoch, our father, a man of character and breeding with the bearing of a Patriarch, Tzivia our mother, who was angelic, small of build and frail, but the most kindly of women. Together with them came a son Joseph, 16 years old, and the youngest daughter, Minnie, 12 years old, and a grandchild, Jennie, 3 years of age.

The older children who were here at the time and who were, as the Americans say, "well fixed," rejoiced and took to their hearts the most welcome arrivals from the old country and immediately the eldest daughter, Sarah Brasch, bade them welcome in her beautiful home.

Since it was the Eve of Passover and the time was short, the eldest son Samuel, came and took his father to the stores and outfitted him with the best of clothes that money could buy. A silk top hat was placed upon his head, and his beautiful gray hair was contrasted beautifully with his new black hat. In a moment he looked and had the appearance of a magnate.

The daughter, Sarah, did the same for our mother and the children, dressing them in the finest of clothes. All together they were beaming with joy, and in this great holiday spirit was arranged the first Sedar of our entire family in America according to our tradition.

This Seder is engraved in my memory and I will never forget it. Now, just as then, I can see my father seated at the head of the table, with a white "Kittel" and a "Yamelke" upon his beautiful white head and his face beaming with a heavenly expression; my mother, with her beautiful holiday clothes looking the picture of a true queen; and every child, together with its family was seated with the greatest respect at the beautifully set table to observe our first family Seder in America.

Soon it was learned by all our friends that Reb Enoch had arrived in America. They came from near and far to greet their dear friends, Enoch and Tzivia Bialystot-sky. On the night of the second Seder there were over fifty people, relatives and friends, present.

Day after day friends and acquaintances came to see our father and mother. Our history tells us our Father Jacob lived in Egypt for 17 years and died at the age of 147. It was during the 17 years that he had lived in Egypt with his family and friends around him that he really enjoyed his life and similarly our father, Reb Enoch, lived in America for 12 yrs, surrounded by his children, grandchildren, and good friends, lived in great happiness with his everloving and faithful wife.

On July 6th, 1913, at the age of 77, in the house of his eldest son, Samuel, where he had made his home, this aged and kindly soul passed away.

The eldest son Samuel kept his mother with him in his home for the rest of her life and through his love and respect for her supplied her with all the necessities of life.

About our mother Tzivia, a special chapter must be written to tell about her goodness and charitable deeds. At the next opportunity I shall write about her.

It was March, 1929, that she breathed her last and was buried in the same plot with our father in Washington Cemetery. During the week of mourning for our mother, the sons and daughters decided to organize a Verein in memory of our dear parents. We named the society The Bnai Enoch, Tzivia Familie Verein, to keep eternal in our hearts and in the coming generation's hearts the memory of our dear departed parents.

In closing I earnestly hope that all our members and friends will make merry to-night and be at our next anniversary and at that time I hope to narrate more effectively about the activities of our Verein and also to include the Biographies of many of our departed members who were very active in our Verein.

Many thanks for making our celebration a happy one.

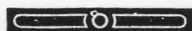
